My Goals

Multicultural Events

I have hosted multicultural food nights at my undergraduate institution and would love to do the same here—TL students cooking their favorite dishes from home to share with others. Other events would include various holiday celebrations, a performance platform for traditional styles of music & dance, and an opportunity to learn about art forms from each other's cultures. These would both celebrate TL's diversity and foster a stronger sense of community.

Increased Support & Guidance

I will work with the Student Services team to make sure Induction sessions for international students provide more guidance than just visa rules and regulations. I will create an international students forum & FAQ booklet to help students understand all of the nooks and crannies of TL. I will advocate for increased financial support to international students facing hardships, as the circumstances (and course fees!) are often much more challenging. I will host events during holidays to fight loneliness and homesickness.

Big/Little Siblings Program

To help ease the transition coming to TL, I will start a mentorship program for new students (little siblings) to be matched with returning students (big siblings). This will allow everyone to feel that, in addition to me, they have another international student they can go to for help or questions. This will also help strengthen friendships and our community!
