



Tips for Surviving Freshers!



We know leaving home and living somewhere new can be nerve-wracking, so we've put together a list of our top tips for surviving freshers' fortnight!

1. Get to know us!

As a student at TL you're automatically a member of TLSU. We're here to support you with whatever you need, whether that's joining or setting up a society, struggling with a job hunt, confused by estate agent documents or you just fancy a chat!

2. Grab your discounts!

Now you're officially a student at TL you can get your hands on tons of amazing discounts. Order a TOTUM card from NUS to get 200 UK student discounts and 1-year FREE ISIC unlocking over 42,000 international discounts. You can also sign up to free discount schemes, such as Unidays and Student Beans, with your TL email address for even more great discounts!!

3. Get involved!

There are so many freshers events that it can be a total headache (and wallet-ache) deciding which ones to go to. We've staggered the events throughout the fortnight meaning that you shouldn't tire yourself out, and with our wristband you'll make a tidy saving on the lot!

4. Don't worry!

Everyone is daunted by leaving home, but if you make sure to register with a doctor straightaway and decorate your new room with some reminders of home, you'll be perfectly equipped to adjust. Avoiding the famous Freshers' flu with plenty of Vitamin C will also make it easier not to hide under the covers. Trust us on the doctor thing, there is nothing worse than feeling crap and being unable to get an appointment!



5. Charm your new housemates!

Trust us on this one... If you're in a shared living situation, be co-operative. Always try to tidy up after yourself and contribute to keeping communal spaces, like the kitchen or bathroom, clean and tidy. It's also good to establish early on what is shared and what isn't in terms of groceries. Tomato Lifesaver Pasta (with Vodka Option)

FEEDS
3-4



1. Make sauce: heat oil gently in pan. Stir in chopped onion, garlic, salt. Cook to soften over low heat for 5-10 mins without colouring.
2. Stir in tomatoes, sugar. Simmer very gently for 15-20 mins. Stir occasionally. Season, taste, adjust balance of flavour by adding lemon, herbs, optional vodka. Cool sauce for later or use immediately.
3. Meantime cook pasta. Drain. Slap back into pan and add a bit of butter/oil and optional vodka if not used in the sauce.
4. Stir hot sauce in. Or slap onto naked pasta. Or put in heatproof bowls, top with cheese and pesto. Grill 'til bubbling.

YOU CAN

- Blitz sauce with blender for smooth version
- Stir in 2 tbsps double cream, mascarpone or Philadelphia at step 3 for touch of luxury
- Skip the onion. Garlic only gives a softer taste
- Chop bacon and chilli in at step 1 for a punchy pasta
- Add 1-2 chopped, de-seeded red/orange peppers at step 1
- Grate a bit of fresh ginger in at step 1 to lift the taste
- Dice a bit of mozzarella into hot sauce just before serving
- Bake it. Layer up any cooked or left-over pasta, sauce, grated cheese, fried sliced aubergine. Top with grated cheese/ Cook 30 mins at 200°C/400°F/gas 6

Basic Tomato Sauce

- 2 tbsps olive oil
- 1 medium onion, very finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed or very finely chopped
- Pinch salt
- 2 x 410g/14oz cans chopped tomatoes
- Pinch sugar
- Sea salt and black pepper
- Squeeze lemon
- Fresh or dried basil/thyme/oregano (optional)
- Vodka (optional)

- 350g/12oz penne
- Butter or extra oil
- Parmesan/Cheddar, freshly grated (optional)
- Pesto (optional)

Your Sexual Health

It is important to get tested at least annually, however there are certain people who are more at risk than others of contracting STIs.

If you have many sexual partners, it is important to get checked more frequently to ensure you catch any infection early on. Also for men who have sex with men, it is advised that you get checked every three to six months as the chance of infection is much higher.

Sexual Health Clinics are a free, confidential and undiscriminating space. It can feel daunting to visit these places, but it is a supportive environment for you to go to without judgement. Alternatively, if you live in the borough of Greenwich, you can get free home-kits, that you complete yourself and mail in, through the Greenwich Sexual Health website.

Staying Safe as a Student

Students are an easy target for many thieves and criminals. so keep your wits about you and be aware about where your possessions are at all times. If you don't need to bring something with you on a night out then leave it at home. Here's some advice to keep you safe:

- Before leaving home ensure all windows and doors are locked.
- Walk in groups, especially at night, and don't get separated from your friends.
- Don't make your mobile phone, camera etc visible. Moped thieves are targeting commuters on their way to and from home.
- Don't carry large amounts of cash, your passport or other valuables unless absolutely necessary.
- Keep an eye on your bags and don't leave them out of your sight.
- Keep wallets and phones in your front pockets or somewhere safe that you can see.
- Avoid sitting in empty carriages on public transport.
- If you get a taxi home make sure it is from a licensed company or is a registered black cab.
- Plan your night bus route, or spare taxi money before you go out - phone batteries just ain't what they used to be!
- Drink responsibly and be aware of your limits.
- Beware of strangers around your drinks and don't leave them unattended as they could get spiked.
- Consider buying a rape alarm and a theft-proof backpack.


