

Who am I?

What do I want to do?

It can be really difficult to understand the LGBTQ+ community if you don't identify with any of its various facets, and I want to ensure that Trinity Laban is a place that openly appreciates the unconditional love of LGBTQ+ allies.

Of course, LGBTQ+ students have to be my main focus, and I wish to continue the good work that Trinity Laban is already doing for Queer students and staff. I have a few smaller goals that I believe would go a long way to increasing representation of Queer students at Trinity. One idea I would like to see is students given the option of either the standard blue lanyard, or a pride flag lanyard when they are assigned their student ID cards.
